





Homework mixed in with the fun and excitement and the first act was over all too soon, as we became Sophomores and stepped into Act II.

Our leaders were ones we all remember . . . John Tadlock--president, Pete Amundson--vice-president, Dixie Berkey--secretary, Lynda Davidson--treasurer, and Cliff Fosse--sgt.-at-arms. We won many leading parts in school clubs and activities, and the stars in the Class of "62" soon became well known. 
SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE


