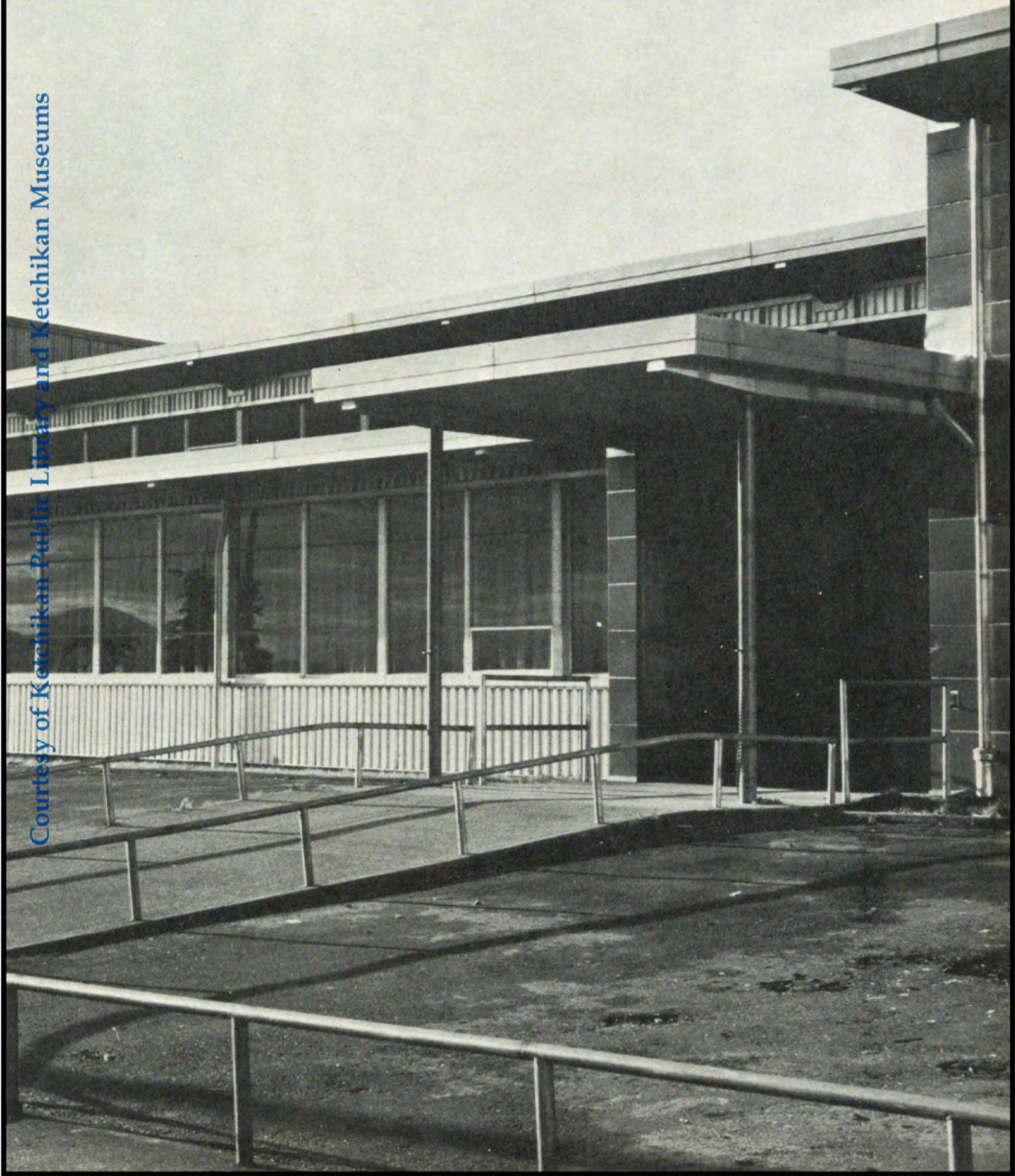

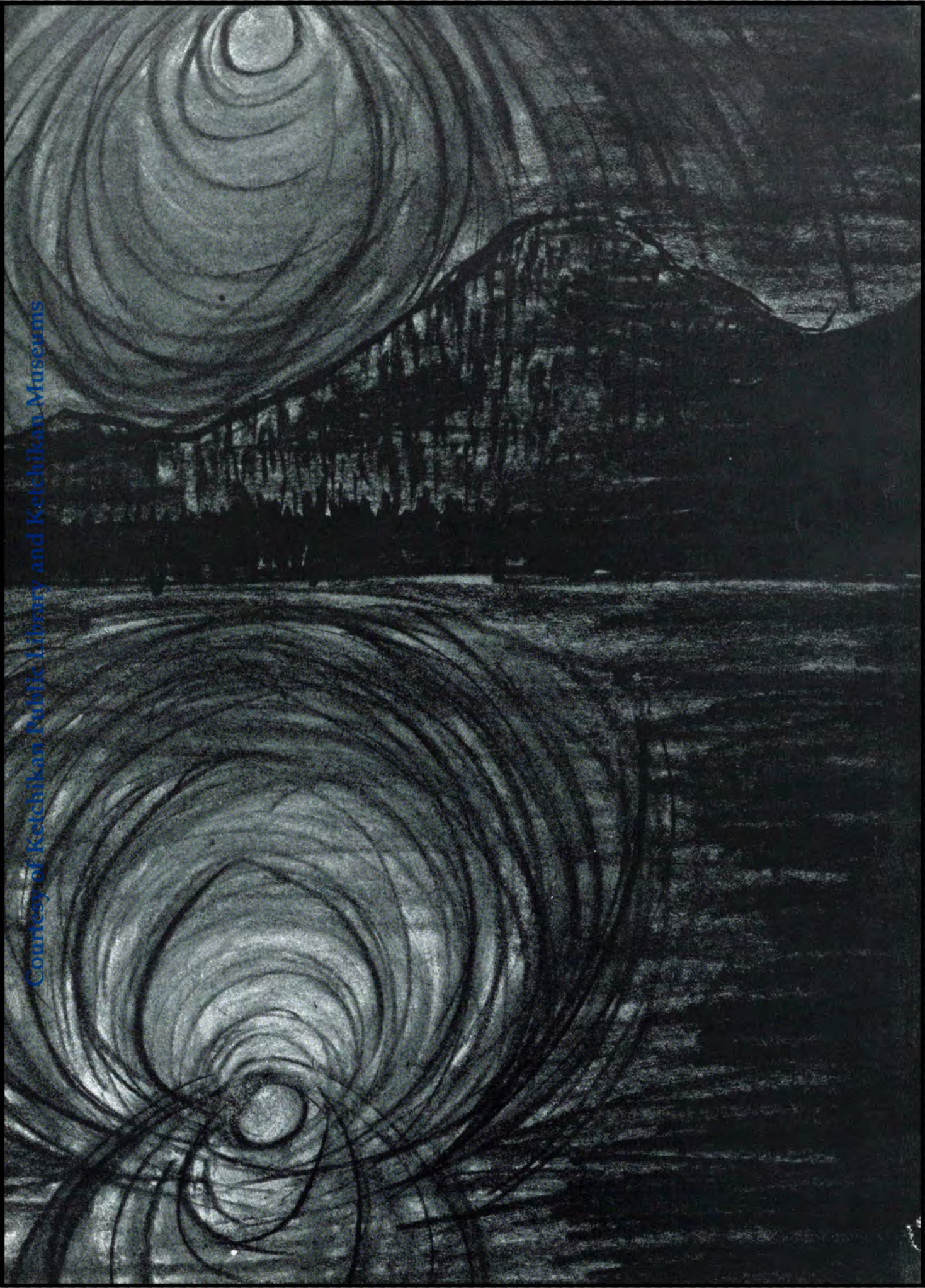

This year the Williwaw staff has adopted a school seal. Plans are to make this a symbol of Kayhi in all future years. It is presented by the class of 1964.

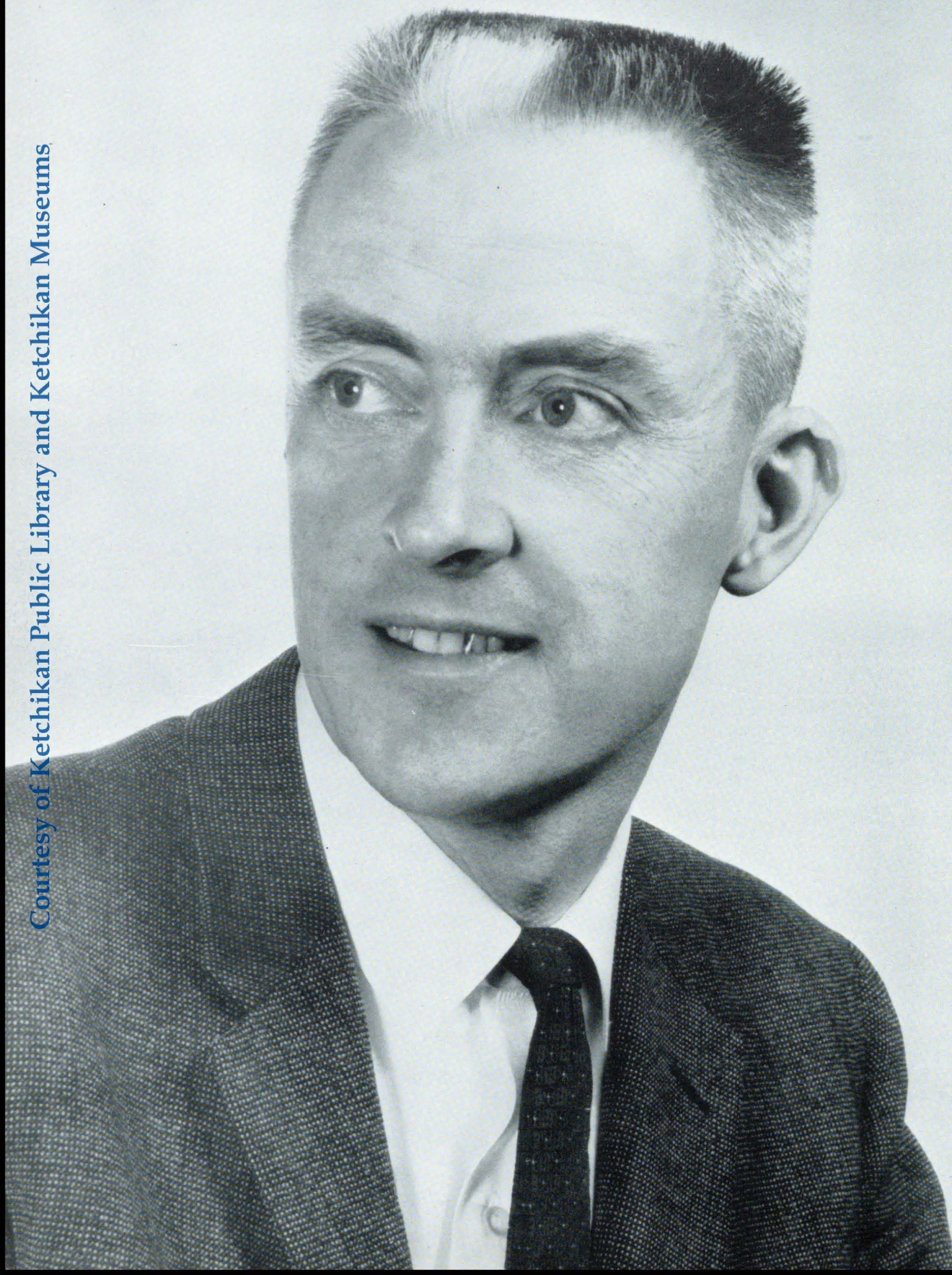

Rest of their bones and souls' delivery!

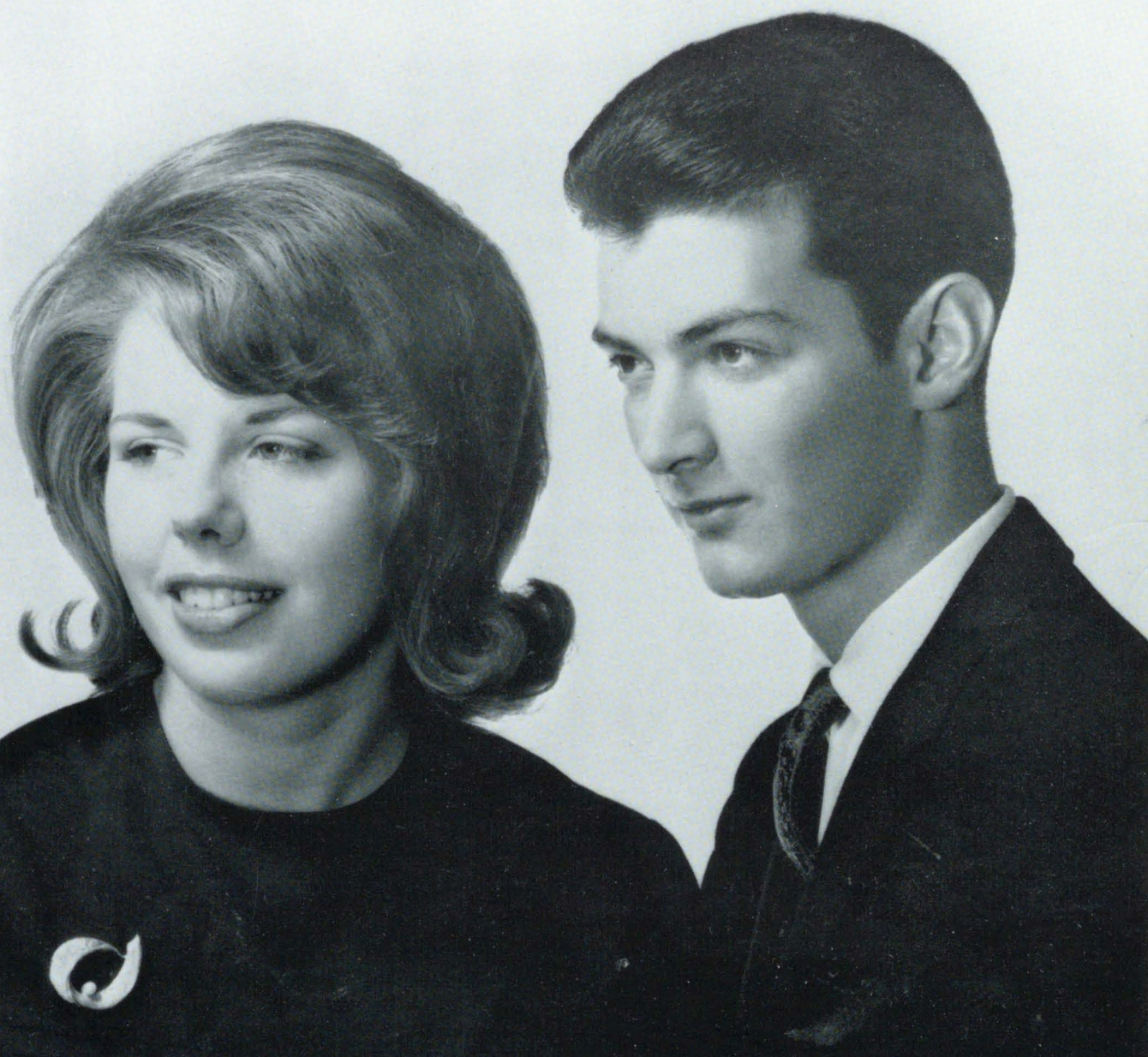

SENIOR CLASS HISTORY

Our first year in the Kayhi SBA was full of pep and vigor. The leaders were Wes Morrison, President; Bruce Pullar (later replaced by Anne Terhar), Vice President; Linda Brice, Secretary; Lou Fiorella, Treasurer; and Arnie Stewart, Sergeant-at-Arms. Our main project was the Freshman Frolic, which ended with a smash as the decorations came down quite unexpectedly.

The second year was full of activities of many kinds. Wes Morrison was once again elected as President; Jim Church was Vice President; Linda Brice, Secretary; Donna Henley, Treasurer; and Larry Kubley, Sergeant-at-Arms. In October of this Sophomore year, some 16 members of our class were "tapped" for Torch. Vivian Sande was annual queen, and Arnie Stewart was placed on the varsity. Linda Brice represented the class on the Pep Squad. GAA was headed by Janice Lind, and four officers of Drill Team were in the class of '64.

Finally we were upperclassmen! At class elections, Jack Halm was chosen President, and second to him in the spot of Vice President was Wes Morrison. Filling in the list of officers were Julie Miller, Secretary; Susan Bass, Treasurer; and Giff Close, Sergeant-at-Arms. Linda Brice once again represented our class in the Pep Squad, while Wes Morrison, David Davis, and Mike Meurs were placed on the varsity. Rod Davidson managed the team. In spring of that year Diane Mead and Jack Cole won high honors as soloists at the Music Festival. Drill Team was headed by members of the Junior class.

In September of 1963, 86 Seniors took their places in the front of the auditorium. New faces were seen in the SBA council. The new SBA officers were Wes Morrison, President; Jack Halm, Vice President; Vivian Sande, Treasurer; Linda Brice, Secretary; and Tom Ramiskey, Sergeant-at-Arms. The officers of the class were elected on the first day of school. Rick Hanas was elected President; Jim Church, Vice President; Julie Miller, Treasurer; Anne Terhar, Secretary. The faculty advisors were Miss Linda Durham and Charles Marksheffle. In December the Senior play, "Mrs. McThing," was presented and greatly increased '64 class funds. The editor of "The Williwaw" was Linda Cotant; assistant editor was Jack Cole. Editor of Kayhitems was Merideth Larsen. Pep Club was headed by Jack Halm, and Janice Lind was in charge of Homecoming. The Senior Ball, "Queen of Hearts," held on December 21, was well attended by students and alumni. Other Seniors in the lights were Wes Morrison, David Davis, and Omer Ketah, who were on the basketball team; and Rick Hanas, who was the manager. Band President was Mary Ann Porter, and Vicki Somerville was President of the Chorus.

At this time we look forward to Graduation and to jobs or schooling which lie ahead.
