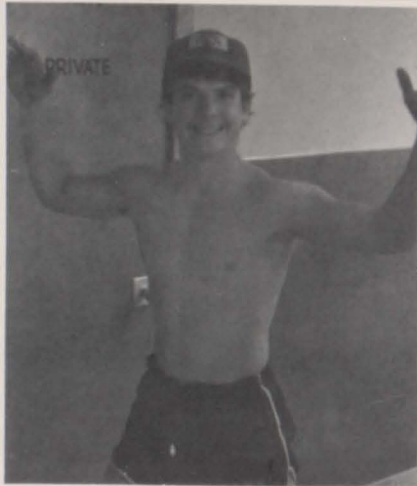

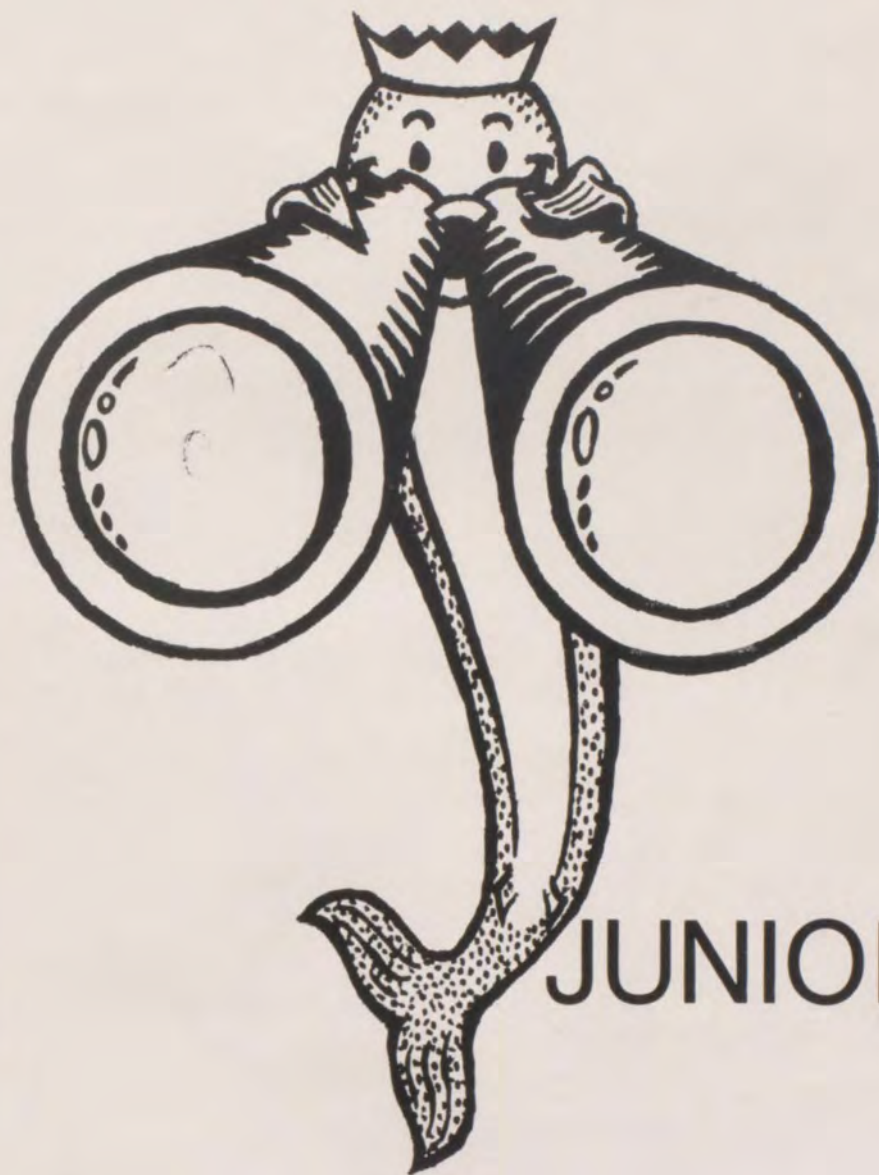

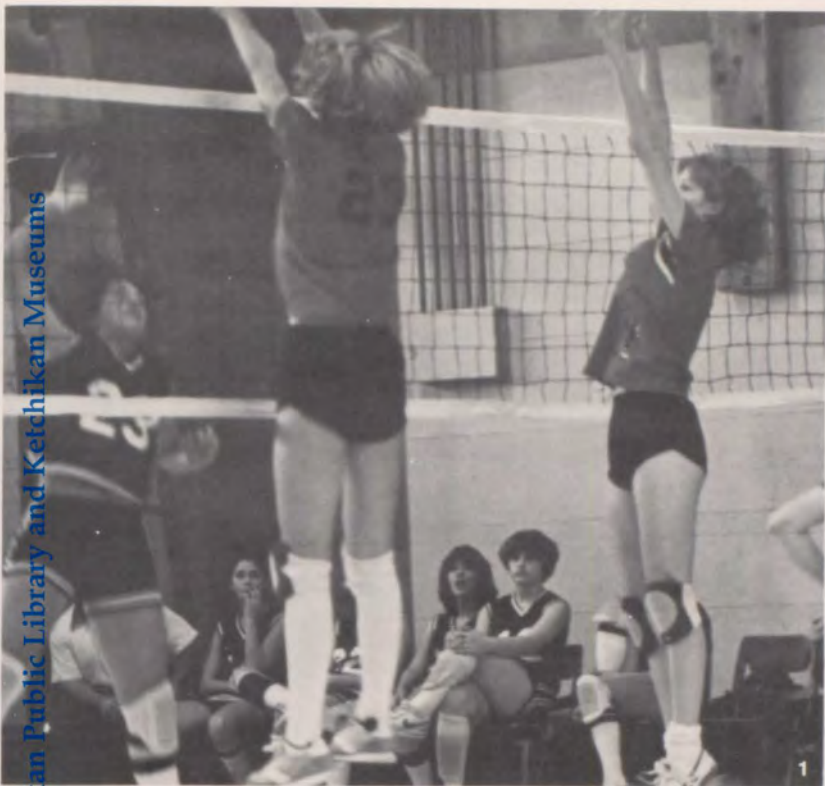

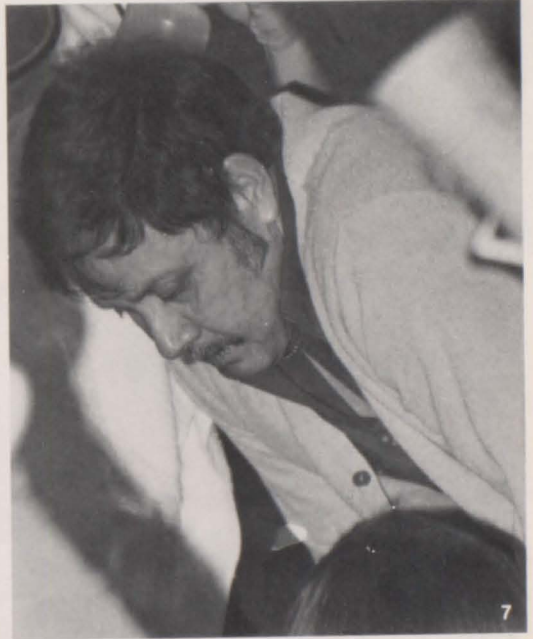

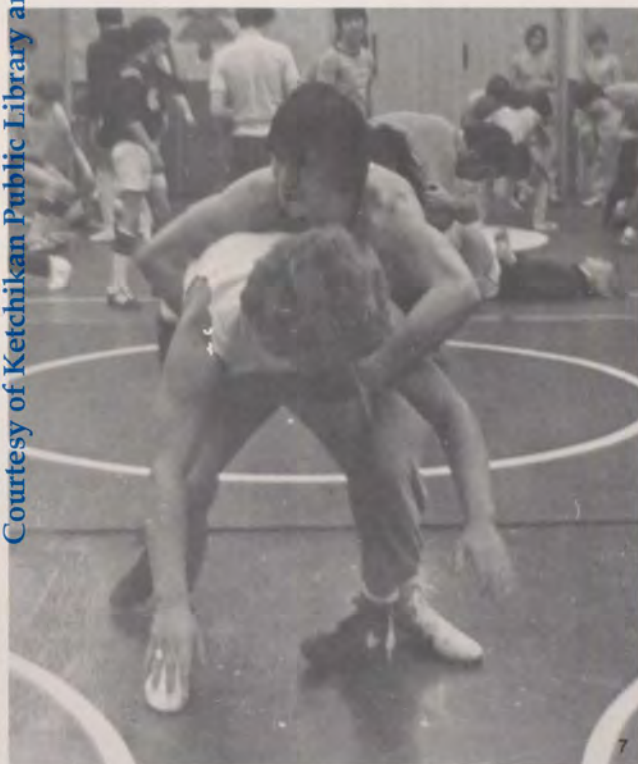
Looks Good

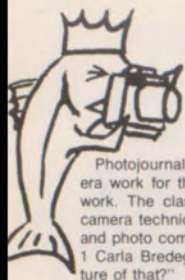

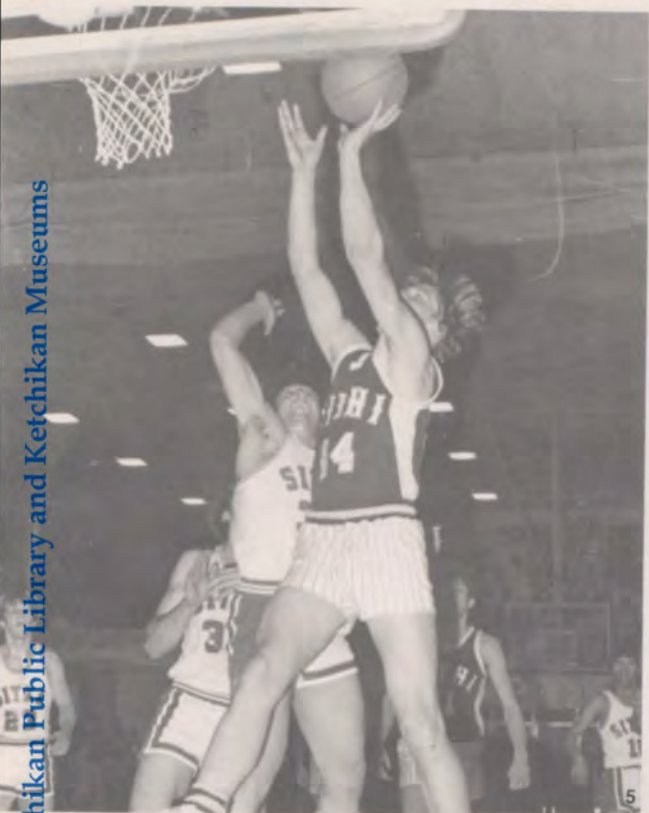
Axelsons' Make

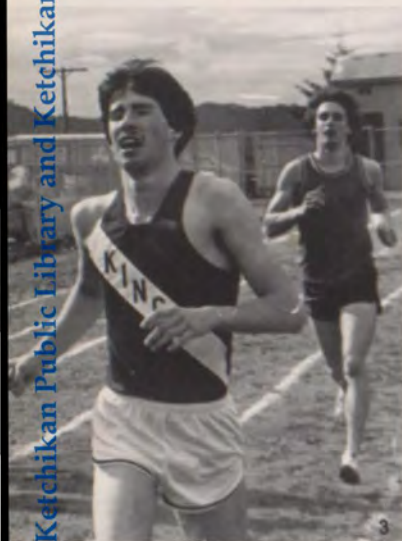
