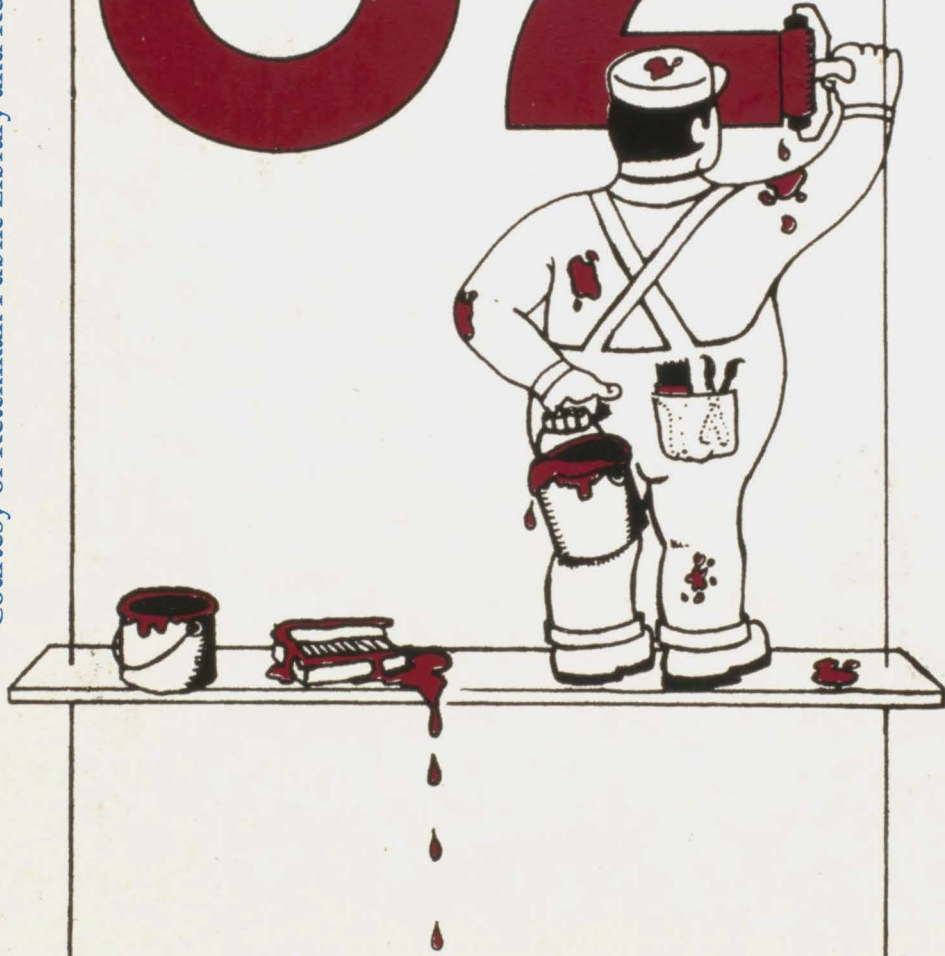
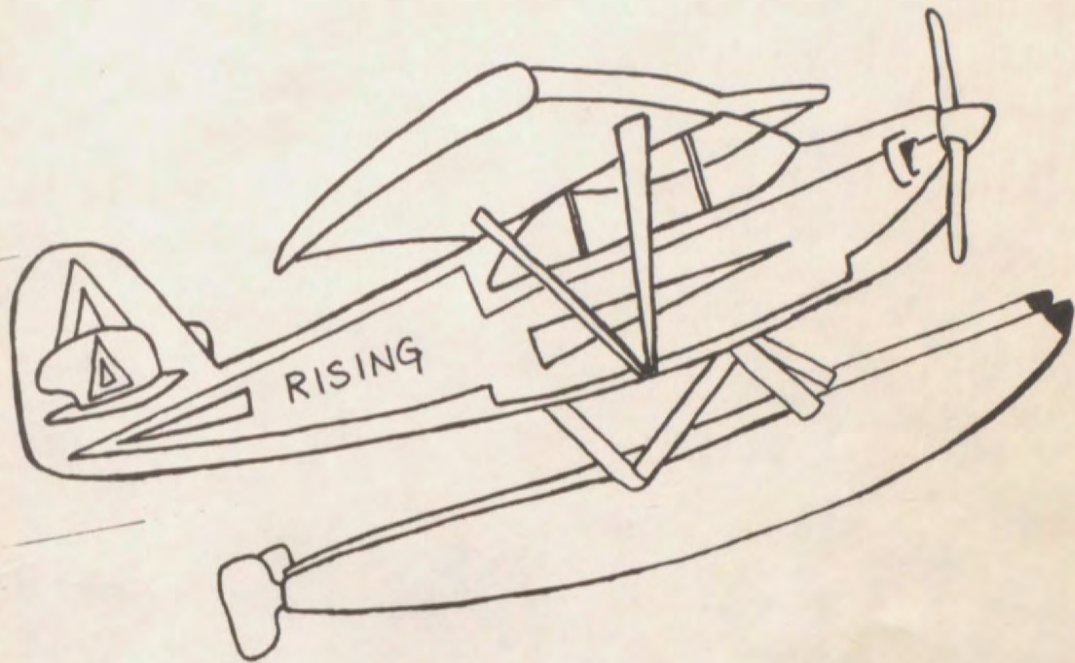

end!

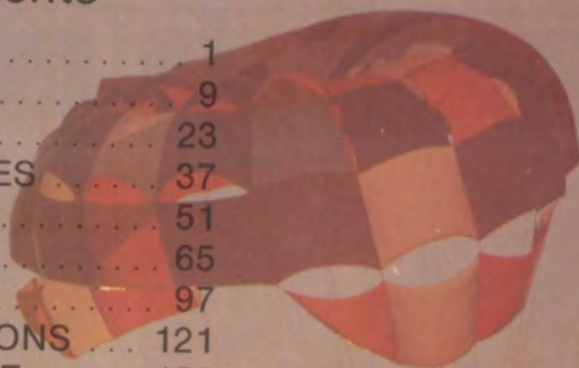

Friendship grew as the year progressed. New faces appeared and responsibilities were taken as students advanced into the future.

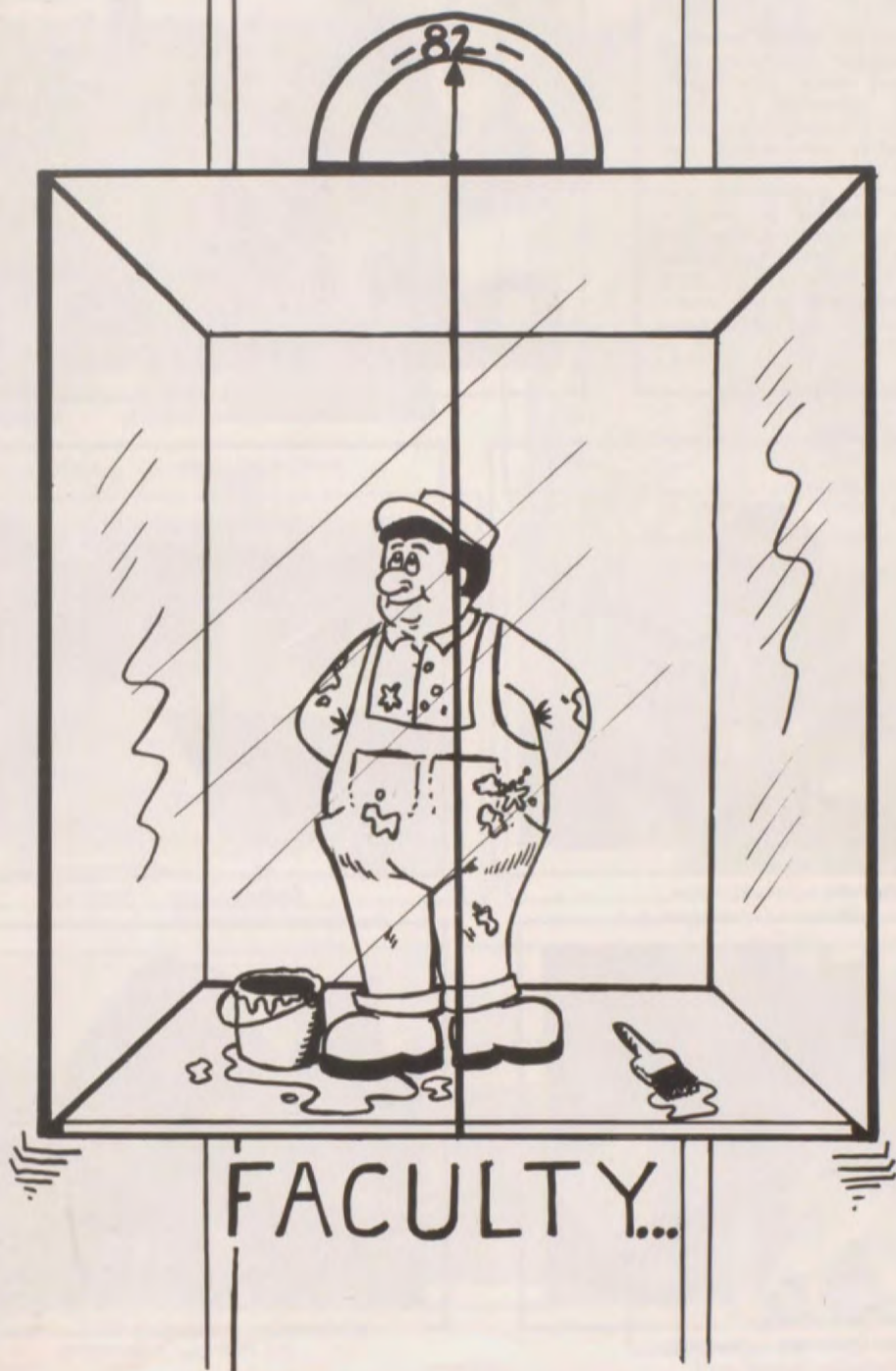

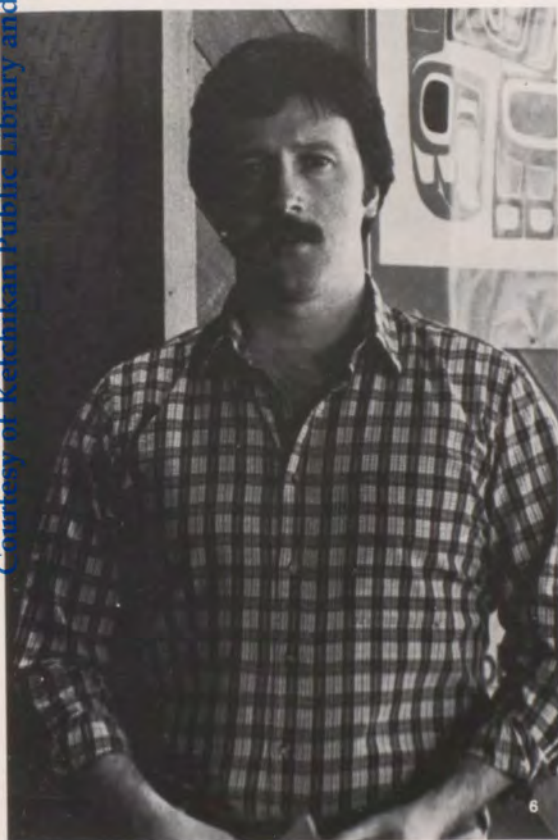
