This policy stated that a student's credits would be automatically withheld when his/her absences exceeded a specified number of days. The student could appeal the loss to a waiver committee, which would discuss the student's request and vote on whether or not to grant a waiver. It was estimated that there was approximately a 17% decrease in absences as a result of the new policy.

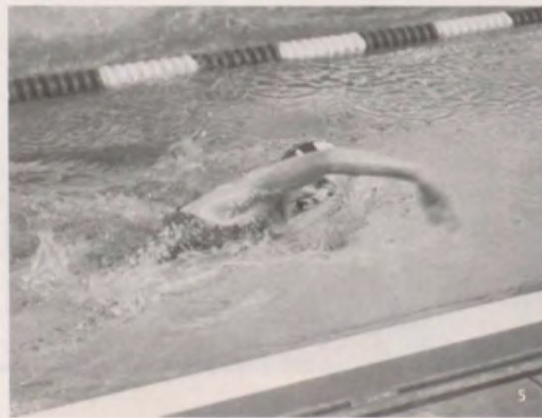
