









By being in Willow, I got to go to all sorts of school events for free, all I had to do was bring a camera and say I was in yearbook. And I didn't even have to take pictures. It saved me a lot of money. With the money I saved, I was able to buy tons of food and eat during my idle hours and yearbook class.



Making a yearbook is very expensive. Did you know that one yearbook costs around \$30,000 to produce? Every yearbook after the first one costs \$15-\$20, and we usually order about 450 yearbooks every year. This year's cover consists of gold signatures over a black background, which costs around \$2,000. And finally, shipping all the yearbooks from Visalia, CA, costs about \$600. If they meet all their deadlines the Spring Supplement is free of charge, otherwise, it costs around \$1,600.



Writing a tally sheet for every page done in the yearbook is important, but writing the correct spelling of names is even more important, which is exactly what senior Amy Farstad is doing. Correct spellings of names on the tally sheets make it so much easier for the index people to index them in the index. This year's index people are senior Aaron Manuel, sophomores Jenny Hoyt & Lenny Krum.

This year is Mrs. Campbell's first year being a yearbook advisor. Being a former yearbook student herself, she understands how the deadline system works. There's just too many deadlines all at once!



Senior Kimberly Boles is this year's #1 Ad Seller. Calling and talking to numerous business managers is a lot of work and very time consuming, and senior Kimberly Boles surpassed expectations and accumulated tons of moolah for this year's budget.

Ever wonder where Willow gets all its money to produce the yearbooks? Probably not, but you're going to read about it anyway. Every year the Willow staff goes to local businesses to sell ad space in our yearbook. They have exactly 20 pages reserved just for ads and each page is worth at least \$400. They also have 20 pages reserved just for Baby Ads which are worth \$240 each page. Another there's yearbook sales. Yearbooks are sold for \$50-\$55. Willow usually gets an order of 350-450 yearbooks every year-\$5 for personalization and another \$5 for the Spring Supplement. 2 out of the 12 signatures in the yearbook are printed in process color, which costs around \$1,000 per signature. You do the math.












