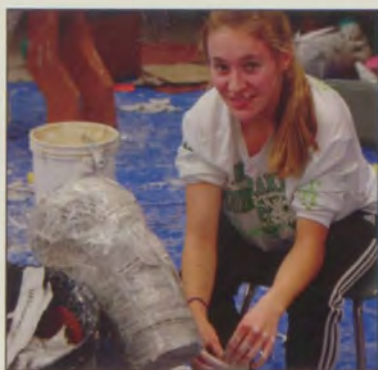

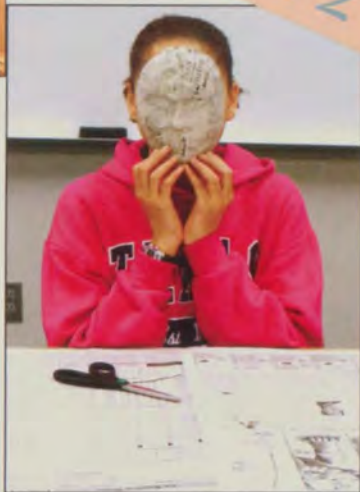

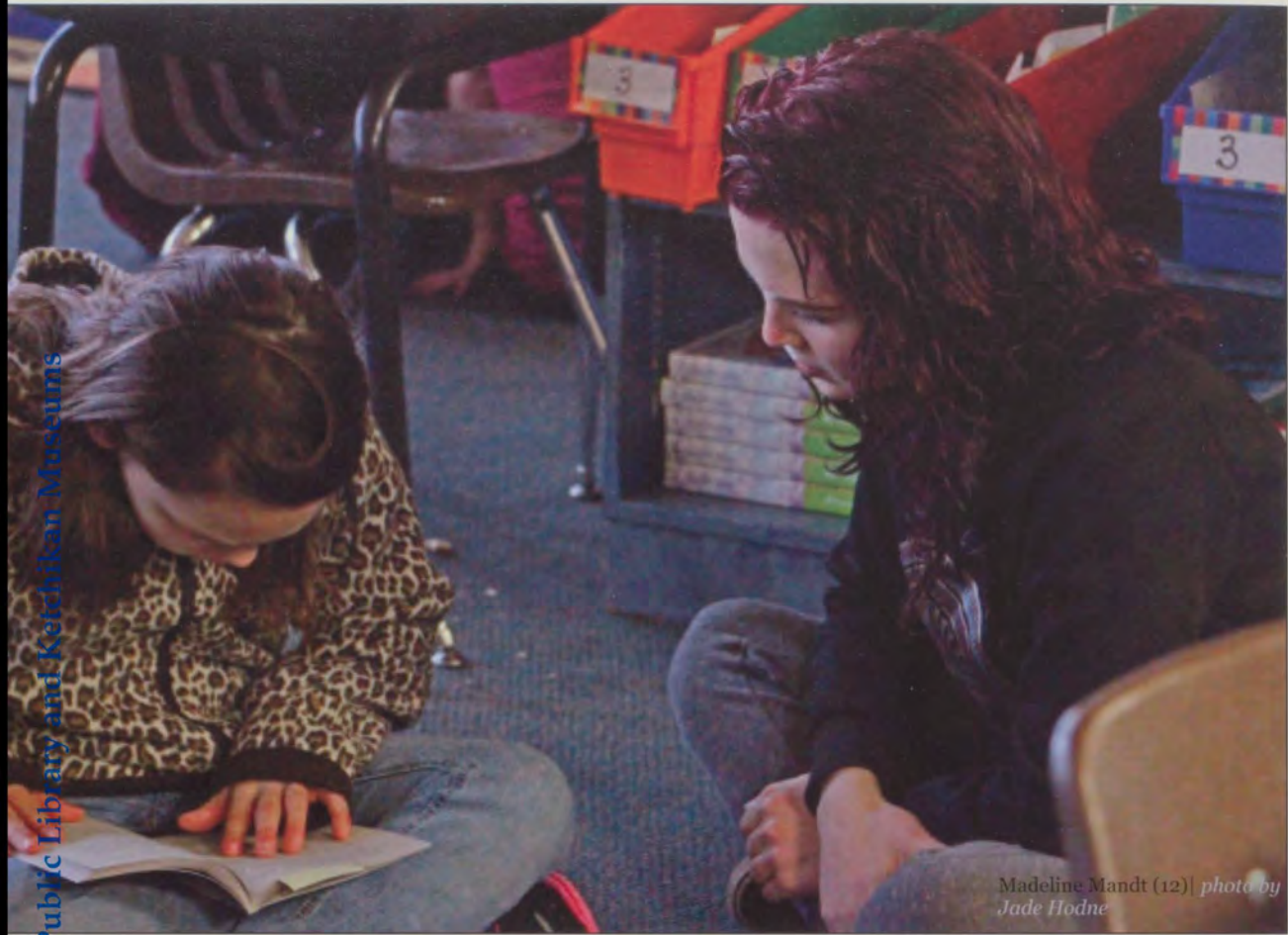

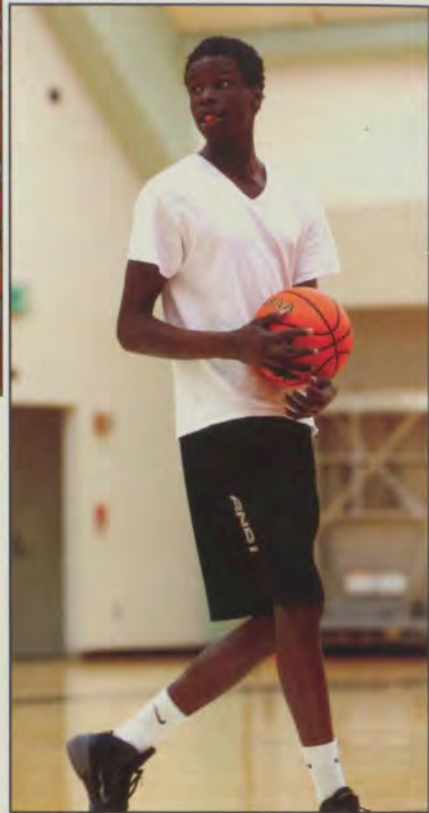

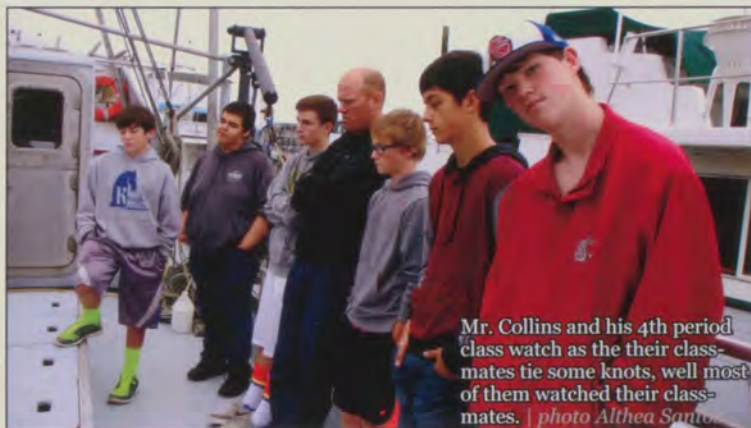

The Tribal Scholars is an alternative program funded through a grant from KIC that provides a learning community for Native Students. They are taught math, science, language arts and social studies in the morning, and then the students go to either Revilla or Kayhi every afternoon for electives. They have interviewed residents at the Pioneer Home, gone to the local museums, and went to Anchorage in October for the Elders and Youth Conference and Alaska Federation of Natives Convention. This spring they began participating in a project with NASA involving an earthquake detection device installed on top of Kayhi. They are also taking a one-credit college course through UAS called "Traditional Foods and Culture of Southeast Alaska Natives" that focuses on tidal foods from both biological and anthropological standpoints.

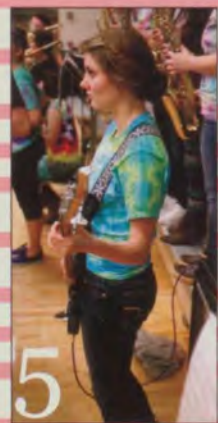

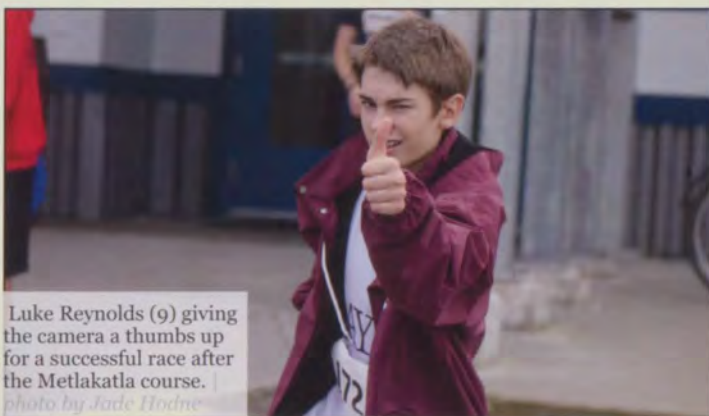

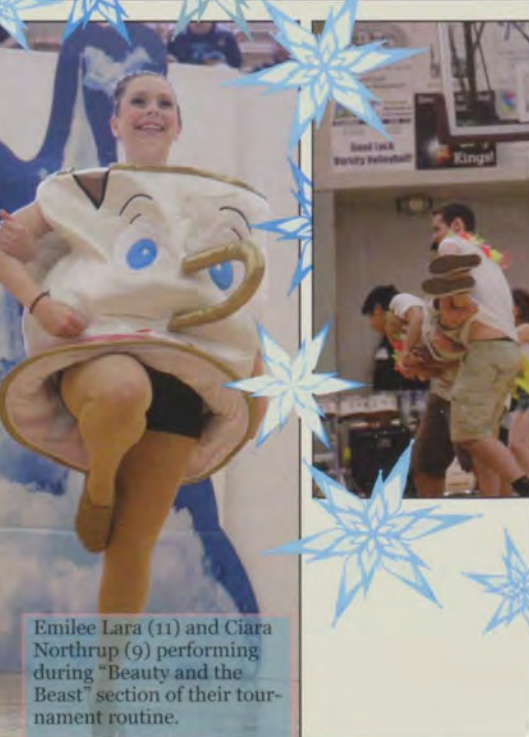

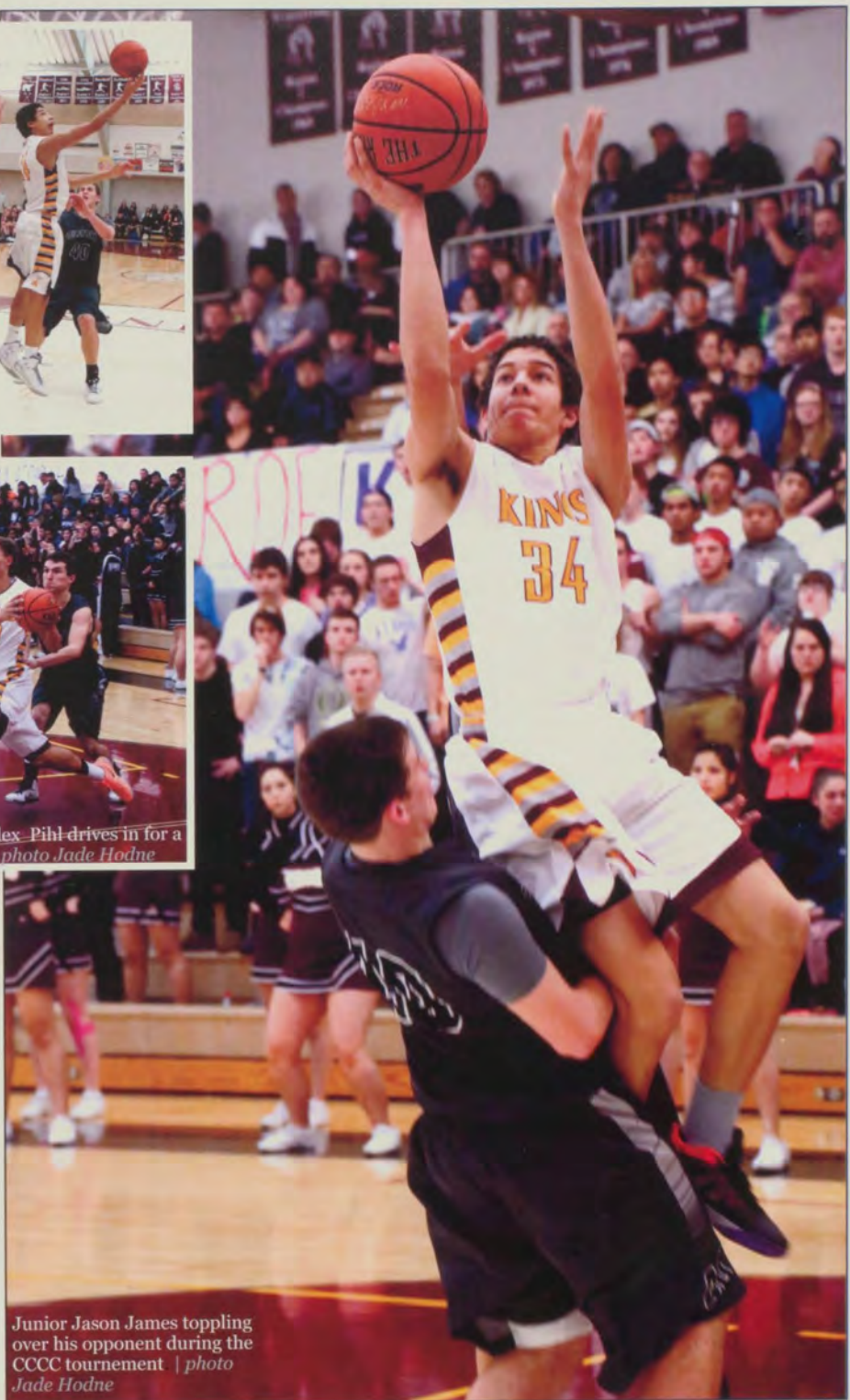
